Treasurer Lillard Elected Southern Regional Vice President for the National Association of State Treasurers

Tennessee Treasurer David H. Lillard Jr. has been elected the southern regional vice president for the National Association of State Treasurers (NAST) next year and will represent the southern region on the NAST executive board.

NAST is an organization open to state treasurers throughout the United States and its territories. The organization develops standards of excellence for state treasurers regarding ethical conduct, policy guidelines and accountability. Also, NAST develops model legislation and guidelines and monitors pending federal legislation and regulatory guidelines that affect state treasury departments.

Treasurer Lillard was elected to the post on Tuesday, August 24 at the NAST annual business meeting during NAST's annual conference in Williamsburg, Va.
